Environment plans

Plan 1: Sight word tree

Objective: Count, pronounce, blend, and segment syllables in spoken words.

Be able to translate written symbols into words.

Read common high-frequency words by sight.

Materials: Construction paper, tape, scissors, Velcro, list of site words

Activity: Students participate in practicing given sight words on the tree.

Plan 2: Writing office

Objective: Be able to write a short story about their opinion on a given topic.

Be able to select a topic and write a short story.

Be able to use the resources on the writing office boards to help support writing ideas.

Materials: Privacy folders with writing resources on the inside (days of the week, months, sight words, writing topics, transition words, components of a story)

Activity: Students will utilize their writing office during writing centers and down time.

Environment plans

Plan 3: Cubbies

Objectives: Be able to understand visuals being presented at cubby area.

Be able to select lunch choices that pertains to them.

Be able to select appropriate hall pass and return it.

Materials: Classroom cubbies, Velcro, laminated names, laminated lunch choices, Laminated hallway passes

Activity: Students will utilize cubby area each morning when arriving to school. Students will put their things away and select their lunch choice.

Plan 4: Morning meeting

Objectives: Be able to examine the weather and the different types.

Be able to use white boards to write answers to morning meeting questions.

Materials: carpet, smart board, small white boards, dry erase markers

Activity: Students will engage in an interactive morning meeting where they will answer questions pertaining to the weather, day of the week, and month of the year.
